MT State Rainbow Dad

Recently while going over the Bible readings for Rainbow Girls, Eastern Star, and Masons I came across a curious difference in translation common to all three that I hadn't been aware of before: "Faith, Hope, and Charity." When I received my first Bible in 3rd grade (a long time ago), and all the other Bibles I have read or acquired since, plus Sunday School and church, the phrase was translated "Faith, Hope, and Love" - Why the difference?

The short answer is that in English word meanings change over time. Years ago (older than me), in the King James version where "Thee's and Thou's", and "doest, maketh, and saith" and other "th" words are found, "Charity" was the preferred translation. In those earlier times "Charity" was primarily defined as benevolent goodwill toward or love of humanity, which fit perfectly in its day. Today "charity" is more associated with the pursuit of money, presumably for those in need, hence Faith, Hope, and the "pursuit of money" is no longer the most appropriate translation for the intended meaning. "Love" is meant to be an active word and "charity", working in love for the benefit of those in need, is a vital component of it, whether we are talking about family, friends we know, or friends we haven't met yet. This is the "service" that Rainbow Girls and all other Masonic-related organizations are dedicated to – Now you know.

PS: It is also possible to love pizza, tacos, and hamburgers, but that is another use of the word "love" not intended to for "Faith, Hope, and Love." If you have read this far treat yourself to one of these other "loves" and have a great Thanksgiving/Christmas season.

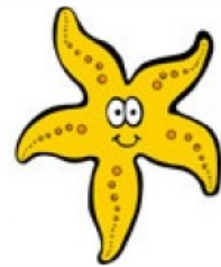

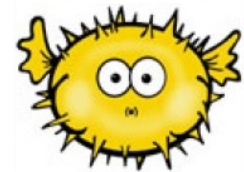
