

#### In Memory of Past State Rainbow Dad Bob Culbertson

Robert W. Culbertson, 70, of Billings, MT passed away on January 16, 2025, after a courageous battle with cancer. He was born October 19, 1954, to H. Carl and Jean (Foos) Culbertson in Bellevue, Ohio. He was the youngest of three children. His dad was a civil engineer working on the initial freeway construction across the nation, so they moved around quite a bit, 13 times by the time he was 12 years old. Growing up he lived in several places in Ohio, Nebraska, New York, and finally ended up in California. He graduated from Las Lomas High School in 1972 and from Montana State University in 1981 with a Bachelor of Architecture degree.



After college, Bob moved to Billings for his first job as an architect. He started attending First Presbyterian Church where he met and married Catherine (Cathy) Lauwers on May 12, 1984. They moved to Great Falls in 1986, where their first son Joshua was born. They moved to Missoula in 1988 for a year and then back to Billings, where their second son David was born.

Bob worked as an architect for 38 years for several firms in Billings, Great Falls and Missoula. He also worked briefly for Eagle Mount, Bed Bath and Beyond and Lowes Home Centers. When he found himself out of work in 2020 due to the pandemic, he traveled to Denver, CO to learn about becoming an Insurance Adjuster, which he did until he retired in October of 2023.

Bob was very involved at First Presbyterian Church teaching Sunday School and at the Wednesday after school program LOGOS. He also taught a variety of adult Sunday School classes and Bible studies over the years, in addition to a myriad of other jobs. He served on the Yellowstone Presbytery Higher Education Committee for seven years, the last 3 years as the Chairman; and was elected to the MSU Billings United Campus Ministries Board of Directors where he had been an active member for about the last 14 years, the last 8 as President of the Board. Other volunteer activities included serving at Eagle Mount Billings, starting as a member of an ad hoc committee which lead to (2) 3-year terms on the Board of Directors serving as a Committee Chair, Secretary, Vice President, and President. He took a hiatus from the Board to fill in as the interim Executive Director. He was deeply involved in the Masonic fraternity. He was a Past Master of Billings Lodge and a Past Patron of Billings Friendship Chapter. At the time of his death, he was the current Worthy Grand Patron of the Grand Chapter of

Montana, Order of the Eastern Star. He also became involved with the local Rainbow Assembly and served as the state Rainbow Dad.

Services will be held at 2 p.m. on April 11, 2025, at First Presbyterian Church, 2420 13th Street West, Billings, MT. Interment will follow the service at the columbarium at First Presbyterian Church. A reception will follow in the Fellowship Hall at First Presbyterian Church.




### MT State Rainbow Dad

Our February planned activities were cancelled because of bad weather and illness. Safety is important!




