


Rainbow Chronicles

ROSE LECTURE


My sister(s), I extend to you a hearty welcome into our Assembly. Rainbow teaches duty fourfold: duty to God, to country, to parents and to each other. It also teaches harmony and friendship. The Rainbow grasp of friendship goes beyond the doors of the Assembly Room, across the vast lands of the United States and across the expanse of the oceans to other girls in every other part of the world. You are now a link of this great undying chain of friendship. Ever remember, a chain is only as strong as its weakest link.

And now I would like to share with you a short verse entitled: "My Hand in God's"

Each morning when I wake to say, "I place my hand in God's today. I know He'll walk close by my side, My every wandering step to guide. He leads me with the tenderest care, When paths are dark and I despair.

No need for me to understand, If I but hold fast to His hand. My hand in His, no greater way, To go in safety though each day.

Tonight, as you knelt at the White Altar of Holy Promise, you pledged your life to Love and Service. You held the hand of God. So now each morning when you awake and look upon the pages of your open Bible, remember that you once held the hand of God. And then again, place your hand in His, and look forward to a new day with renewed courage and faith.

(The speaker places a small rose in each new member's hand.)

On this occasion, I have placed in your hand a rose. This small red rose of Rainbow symbolizes a girl's love and devotion for her mother, who, through sacrifice and prayer, made this day possible for you to enjoy. So, tonight when you tell your mother, or someone who has taken her place, about this ceremony, give her your rose, and when you kiss her goodnight, remind her that you love her.

(The speaker, who is giving the speech, now enters the Altar area from Hope's station, places the additional roses on the altar.)

And now, in the memory of every girl's mother, and those who have passed into the golden city beyond. I place these remaining roses upon the Altar and bid you welcome into our Assembly with the hope that the words of Love and Service will guide you through a happy and successful life.

Dad's Talk

Tonight, you have been witness to many lessons, but one of the most important is the love and respect Rain-bow girls have for their parents. While as teenagers, Rainbow takes us on a journey of stations to reach the mythical Pot of Gold at the end of the Rainbow, as parents, your children are the Pot of Gold at the end of their Rainbow.

Just a few minutes ago, we talked about our love and devotion for our mothers, whose prayers and sacrifices made this day possible. We'd now like to talk to our dads.

As Rainbow girls, we'd like you to be proud of us, just as we are proud of you. You may not know much about Rainbow yet but it will be special to you because it is special to us.

Dad's want the best for their daughters. One of the best expressions of this is from the song "I Hope You Dance." It says in part:

I hope you never lose your sense of wonder,

You get your fill to eat but always keep that hunger,

May you never take one single breath for granted.

I hope you dance.

I hope you still feel small when you stan beside the ocean.

Whenever one door closes I hope one more opens.

Promise me you'll give faith a fighting chance.

I hope you will dance.

Today I present you with the Rainbow Dad pin. Wear it with pride as a reminder of the seven mileposts in your daughter's journey to the end of the Rainbow and of your commitment to help guide and protect her on her journey. Take some time each day to share with your daughter. Offer to attend Rainbow meetings; it is in these moments that you will have the chance to watch her grow in service and leadership on her path to true womanhood. Attend often, for this journey, like all others, has an end and once travelled may never truly be retraced.





Supreme Centennial Proficiency/Membership Program

Supreme is implementing a Proficiency/Membership program over the next two years. There are four levels to the program. The completion of each level will earn the participant a ribbon and completing the fourth level will earn a special pin. The levels must be completed in order and one can not continue to the next level until the previous level is completed. There are over 100 proficiency questions to choose from.



C3The first level requires completion of 10 questions,

C3 The second requires 15 new questions,

C3 The third level requires 20

C3 The fourth level requires 20.

Participation in level 1 begins August 1 and runs until December 1.
