

She instituted the positions of State Mother Advisor and State Rainbow Dad and revived the Junior Grand Executive Committee. Mrs. Hopkins developed the "Delegates Gathering" process for election of GWA and changed the voting process so that every Rainbow Girl who had completed their proficiency has a vote. These changes will forever reflect Mrs. Hopkin's influence on Montana Rainbow.

Mrs. Diane Sherick served as Supreme Deputy of Montana from 2004 to 2010. Prior to her appointment as Supreme Deputy she served many years on the Grand Executive Committee. During her tenure as Supreme Deputy the concept of housing Grand Assembly activities and sleeping accommodations under one roof was established. This brought a new level of efficiency to the Grand Assembly schedules as it eliminated the need for traveling from hotels to the meeting location. Mrs. Sherick also implemented the practice of featuring ads in the Grand Assembly program book to help defray Grand Assembly expenses. "Auntie Diane" often expressed her pride in her Rainbow Girls with the comment that she was so proud "her buttons could burst."

The Yellow Region is assigned to Billings Jewel #24. The jurisdictions are Canada, Michigan, Connecticut, New York, Vermont, Colorado.

The Green Region is assigned to Hardin Assembly #33. The Jurisdictions are Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Ohio, New Mexico, Indiana.

The Blue Region is assigned to Great Falls Faith Assembly #3. The jurisdictions are New Jersey, North Carolina, South Carolina, Aruba, West Virginia and Virginia.

The Indigo Region is assigned to Garden City Assembly #55. The jurisdictions are Georgia, Rhode Island, Alabama, Florida, Kentucky, Brazil.


