

In Memory of "Mama L"



Montana Rainbow's Mama L passed away peacefully on December 28, 2024 after a long battle with Alzheimer's. Known to the rest of the world as Joyce Lindberg, Mama L was a long-time supporter of Rainbow from the local level to the international level.

Mrs. Lindberg was born on February 4, 1932 in Blackwell, Oklahoma. She graduated from Sweet Grass County High School in Big Timber,

Montana. Her family then moved to Billings where Joyce attended Rocky Mountain College. At the time she was a bit of a pioneer, being one of 6 girls attending the college. During her time at Rocky she was involved in campus activities including being a cheerleader. Joyce transferred to Phillips University in Enid, Oklahoma where she graduated with a degree in English.

After college, Joyce returned to Billings where she met her future husband, Charles Lindberg, through their mutual attendance at the First Chrisian Church. They were married on November 29, 1953. Charles traveled much with his job with International Harvester, leaving Joyce in charge of the homelife. Charles' job kept them moving; 6 times in 15 years, before settling in Sidney, MT for 14 years. Sidney is where Joyce and Charles raised their 5 children. In 1982, Joyce and Charles transferred back to Billings. While there, Joyce started her own business, Calico Cakes. Her delicious cakes for all occasions were in high demand. In 1992, after Charles had retired, they moved to Red Lodge.

It was in Sidney that Joyce first became active with the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls when her oldest daughter joined the local Assembly. Joyce worked actively with Sidney Assembly, becoming the Mother Advisor for several years. She went on to serve

Rainbow on the state level, being appointed as Supreme Deputy of Montana in 1994 and later as Supreme Inspector from 2002 until her retirement from the position in 2004. She was elected as a member of the House of Gold in 2004. Joyce was appointed to the office of Supreme Service for the 2014-2016 term of Supreme Assembly. She remained active in Supreme Assembly activities until her retirement from the House of Gold in 2022.

Mama L was one of Montana Rainbow's most devoted supporters, continuing to attend Rainbow events for years following her retirement as Supreme Inspector. Mama L was always an active participant and a good sport. Perhaps one of the most memorable events was at Grand Assembly 2004 when Supreme Inspector Mama L had challenged the Assemblies to a membership contest. The prize for the winning Assembly was to style Mama L's hair. Billings Jewel Assembly won the competition and gave Mama L a very modern hairdo of Rainbowcolored Liberty spikes. She kept the hairdo in place, not only for the duration of Grand Assembly, but also through Grand Chapter which immediately followed Grand Assembly.

Mrs. Lindberg is survived by her five children; Joy-Lyn McDonald of Sidney, MT, Bruce Lindberg of West St. Paul, MN, Ted Lindberg of Sartell, MN, Keith Lindberg of Sidney, MT, and Irene Haynes of Billings, MT. She was preceded in death by her husband Charles.

A memorial service will be held at a later date. Memorial donations are suggested to the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls, Shriner's Hospital, the Alzheimer's Association or a charity of the donor's choice.

In honor of Mama L., Montana Grand Assembly will donate \$500 to the Shriner's Hospital in Spokane in her name.



Wow! The last couple months have been busy!


